Romance is in the Air- To celebrate Valentine's Day the LRC featured a romance themed book





There were no 'hard' words in this book, it was a really 'easy' read. Review written by Zoya Yr7






I recommend the LRC to all pupils to use as much as possible. If you need to do homework, you can use the computers


