Guiding Questions

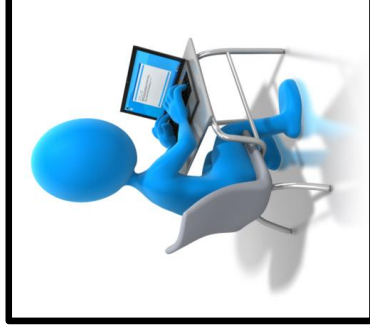
- What is your new school called?

Activity One
