REMEMBRANCE DAY PARADE

On the 11th November this year, school stopped to remember those men and women who, in every conflict since the Great War, have given their lives to defend our freedom. As pupils belonging to the army, navy and air cadets stood to attention in their uniforms in the winter sunlight, pupils from Year 7 and 11 were invited to reflect particularly on those men and women from the armed services who had suffered with their mental health as a result of their war experiences. In the two minutes silence, as leaves floated gently from the cherry tree in the courtyard, we prayed for those who had been unjustly punished for not being able to fight





because of their PTSD and all those whose lives had been cut short as a result of the lack of understanding about mental health issues connected to war.

Later that evening, staff, Governors and relatives gathered in Sacred Heart Parish Church for our annual Mass of Remembrance. As always, this poignant service gave us time to reflect on past friends, colleagues, governors and pupils who have died since the opening of our school in 1981. Sadly and inevitably, the list grows longer every year but this annual event in our school calendar, as with the Remembrance Parade earlier in the day, gives us a moment in our busy lives to stop, remember, reflect and give thanks for the lives of all who have gone before us.

SAFEGUARDING

Financial Support

The Household Support Fund is the government funding to support vulnerable families with food costs and utility bills between October 2021 and March 2022 (it was previously known as the Local Support Grant, and prior to that the Winter Grant Fund). If you have previously been in receipt of the grant funding you will automatically be notified about the new household support fund and, if still on benefits, will be paid £40 per child to cover the Christmas and New Year period for meals and towards their general household bills. Please note you do not need to apply again if this is the case.

For any new benefits related FSM children, you can make your first claim via the following application form: Household Support Fund. Families will receive a payment for each child either direct into your bank account or you can request post office vouchers.

Further payments will be made to cover February half term. If you have any questions regarding the application form or the household support fund HouseholdSupportplease contact: Fund@warrington.gov.uk or you can contact the education team education@warrington.gov.uk.

For any family not on benefits related free school meals who hit financial crisis over the winter months you can apply for the existing Welfare Assistance Fund which is a one off payment which is awarded based on an individual needs basis.

Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) over Christmas

HAF is available for all children across Warrington who are eligible for free school meals, in addition to this a small percentage has been awarded to vulnerable children who are not in receipt of free school meals. The HAF programme for Warrington is inclusive and working parents can also pay to attend HAF provisions. There are provision across different HAF Warrington from 20th December through to 6th January. You can book your child/children on to these provisions directly with a HAF provider or via the booking system.

Staying Safe Online

Children have greater access to the internet during the holiday period and whilst we are all aware of the benefits of the online world, we are also conscious that there are risks for children. As a school we have signed up to National Online Safety which provides a wealth of information from guides, webinars, courses, and many more. If you have not done so already, please follow the link and sign up as a

parent, once you have done this you will be able to download the app. In addition to this there are many other sites that provide information and support.

The Big Ask



The 'Big Ask' was a survey aimed at understanding the lives of children. As part of

the survey, children were able to highlight their experiences of peer-onpeer abuse and sexualised bullying.

In response to the report St Gregory's have been working with pupils through assemblies and PHSE to ensure that they understand what peer-on-peer abuse is, how to spot the signs, what to do if they or someone they know is being abused, how to report any concerns that they have as well as what a healthy relationship looks like.

To support parents, the Children's Commissioner of England has produced a booklet to support parents and carers in talking to their child/children about online sexual harassment. You can access this booklet and many other useful resources on their website.


ANTI-BULLYING AND HATE CRIME

and have progressed into the next round of matches in the competition which will take place in the New Year.


Cross Country
