

## Uniform

Thank you to all parents/carers for supporting us in ensuring pupils are wearing the correct uniform to school. As a polite reminder pupils should wear a formal shoe, trainers

are not permitted; hoodies are not allowed, only a school jumper can be worn underneath the school blazer. A coat may be worn to and from school and outside at break and lunch if a pupil is cold.



Mobile phones should be switched off and not be taken out during the school day. If a pupil breaches this then the device will be confiscated

overnight in line with our mobile phone and behaviour policy.

**Earbuds** should also be put away and not taken out during the school day.

Smart Watch notifications should be switched off so pupils do not receive texts etc. Thank you, in advance, for your support.

**E-cigarettes** Many parents will be aware e-cigarettes have become popular amongst young people; their designs aimed specifically at them. Whilst some parents may consider that it is not as bad as smoking, this view is not shared by St Gregory's. It is not risk free and there is no evidence available of the long-term effects vaping has on young people.

E-cigarettes are banned items at St Gregory's and pupils must not bring them into school.

The Police have reported that some shops in Warrington are selling vapes to young people despite the fact that they are illegal to buy under the age of 18. If you suspect that your child is vaping, please speak to them about this and ensure that they do not bring an e-cigarette into school.
