In our report, Ofsted said, "Pupils at St Gregory's are happy, confident and welcoming to visitors. They like each other. There is a strong sense of community across the school. This reflects the school vision, 'One family inspired to learn'. One pupil said: 'we are cared about as individuals but, because everyone cares, that makes us all one.'

Our school community has a strong sense of 'standing up and being counted' as this enables our pupils to both develop and show their talents, whilst leaving a positive footprint on their community and beyond. Ofsted reported, "The work the school is doing to promote awareness around hate crime and leaving a 'positive footprint' is well developed. Pupils work side by side with staff leading on these initiatives. They are rightly very proud of the work they are doing".

The Section 48 inspection report also noted, "Pupils embrace the demands that membership of the school community expects. In their own words, this is because mission is, "about who we are and why we are here, and the values we share." School Council, Young Leaders, Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and inclusion in the Warrington Hate Crime Partnership are key examples of pupil action".

At St Gregory's your child will be safe and happy, our Safeguarding procedures and processes are second to none and we have a positive culture of being a 'Listening and Telling' school. Safeguarding is regarded as highly effective by Ofsted inspectors in their report.

After five years at our school, your child will be well prepared both personally and academically for the next stage of their lives and St Gregory's pupils are highly sought after by colleges, universities, apprenticeships and employers.

#### **Strong Academic Success**

St Gregory's is well known for a long track record of very strong examination performance. The school performs above the national average for attainment and progress year after year and all subjects perform higher than the national average in their subject areas too. A number of subjects perform substantially above national averages including Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Modern Foreign Languages and Performing Arts.

We are proud that exceptional performance is achieved by all groups of children, including those with SEN and pupils with English as an additional language. Higher ability pupils excel and each year around a third of all grades are between grades 7 to 9. Our performance in examinations for all pupils demonstrates that children are treated as individuals where their strengths are realised.

### Will I get a place at St Gregory's?

As a result of our success, St Gregory's is understandably a very popular school and there can be competition for places, however, every year we do welcome 240 pupils into Year 7. Pupils come to our school from over 30 different primary schools across Warrington including our 6 Catholic partner schools as well as St Phillips Westbrook, Callands, Westbrook Old Hall, Sankey St James, St Barnabas, Great Sankey Primary School, Evelyn Street and Penketh South to name but a few.

Around a third of our pupils are not baptised Catholics and our admission criteria does allow for non-Catholics to apply for a place via criteria points 1, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 depending on your circumstances. Parents of many different faiths and no faith view our ethos as something they want their child to be part of and embrace.

To conclude, at St Gregory's, your child will receive a well-rounded education that provides academic success, strong personal development, and the ability to make a difference through our charity work and campaigns ensuring they will be prepared to move on to the next stage of their lives as confident, highly capable young people all guided by strong Catholic values.
