Art and Design



What does progress look like in Art and Design?

- Pupils will record their observations and insights through both practical work and written annotations. They will focus on three key areas:
- Skills in making art, craft and design. Recording of ideas and developing a
 personal response will include opportunities to learn about drawing, painting,
 printing, textiles and 3D construction. Pupils will_develop increasing control of
 materials and techniques.
- **Developing ideas through research and experimentation.** Pupils will design and refine original, creative ideas through experimentation. They must be willing to take risks and recognise mistakes as a part of their learning journey.
- Knowledge and Understanding. Pupils will explore the work of Artists,
 Craftspeople and Designers from a range of cultures and genres. They must
 describe and analyse artwork and explain how it inspires them. Pupils will
 communicate their creative process and evaluate their work.

How will my child's progress be assessed in Art and Design?

- Pupil progress will be measured against our 'Progression Map' which you will find in your child's book
- Feedback in their books will tell them how to make the next steps in their learning
- A formal assessment of progress will take place at the end of each project.

What can I do to help my child to make progress in Art and Design?

- Provide your child with an A4 sketchbook and art materials. These are available to buy from the school shop
- Help them to find out about the work of Artist's, Craftspeople or Designers that are relevant to their project.
- Encourage them to talk about artwork, including their own. Ask them to explain what they like about the work and to think about why it was created.
- Encourage your child to review the targets in their sketchbook and practise the skills suggested by their teacher.
